Ivington CE Primary School's Sports Funding

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding for primary school PE and sport. In 2021/22 this will be approx. £17,020 for Ivington CE Primary School. The PE and sport premium funding can only be spent on this provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

- Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport in order to:
- Develop or add to the PE and sports activities that the school already offers
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in later years

How will we be spending the Sports' Funding and who will benefit?

The main focus for the use of this money is to increase participation in PE and sport so all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and to reach their full potential. This can include training for staff and teachers; providing additional opportunities for children to participate in sport at all levels; purchasing specialist equipment; and enhancing the PE curriculum to engage all learners by making it more varied.

Key achievements to date

- Children have been given the opportunity to access a wider variety of sport due to new equipment being bought.
- Children have access to an all-weather running track which enables the Daily Mile to take place.
- Staff have an increased confidence in delivering high quality PE lessons. This has been developed by attending training or working alongside specialised staff during PE lessons.

- Children have access to a variety of after school clubs delivered by professional coaches.
- Children are more active during playtime and lunchtime. We have listened to feedback from our sports captains and have purchased new equipment for children to have access to during playtimes. This equipment is available daily.
- The school has enabled swimmers to swim more regularly so that all children leaving KS2 leave with a good standard of swimming.

How will we check its impact each year?



Ivington CE Primary School uses a number of different methods in order to evaluate the impact of the PE and Sport Premium Funding:

- Staff continue to show high standards of PE teaching and have confidence in planning and delivering PE sessions. This will come from observations and feedback.
- The pupils' voice – children will provide feedback and form part of the measuring of the impact.
- The continued high levels of children participation in extra-curricular activities will be tracked and monitored.

How will our plans be sustainable in the future?

- By continuing to critically evaluate and look at the impact of the past and current funding.
- Through linking with our wider community and sports on offer locally.
- Through the school community valuing the importance of their own health and well being
- Through improving the facilities, we have in our school

Ivington CE Primary School intend on spending the money in the following areas. A number of the following objectives are a continuation of the previous years' objectives as they have had such a positive impact on the school's sporting success. Other objectives remain as it is felt that they can still be improved upon or due to COVID 19 we did not have the chance to implement them.
