

Ivington C.E. Primary School PE and Sport Premium 2023-2024

What is the PE and Sport Premium?

There are five key indicators which schools should secure improvements in:

- 1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- 2. Profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport Budget

For the school year 2023-2024, Ivington C.E. Primary School received £17050.00.

£4590.96 was brought forward from the school year 2022-2023.

Total spent = £18,784.67

Use of the PE and Sport Premium Funding

The school's funding is to be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Ivington C.E. Primary School is free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the PE and sport provision. The main focus for the use of this money is to increase participation in PE and sport, so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and to reach their full potential. This can include training for staff and teachers; providing additional opportunities for children to participate in sport at all levels; purchasing specialist equipment; and enhancing the PE curriculum to engage all learners by making it more varied.

A review of how the money was spent last year can be viewed on the school's website.

Ivington C.E. Primary School intend on spending the money in the following areas. Many of the following objectives are a continuation of the previous years' objectives as they have had such a positive impact on the school's sporting success.

Other objectives remain as it is felt that they can still be improved upon.

- To trial a new method of effective assessment to know more about the pupils' current level of skills in Physical Education, in order to target progression more effectively.
- To continue to train other members of staff through observations and demonstrations as well as a training afternoon.
- To provide Playground leaders with more opportunities to showcase and develop their leadership skills.
- To continue to utilise Pupil Voice throughout the school to shape our curriculum and extra-curricular activities.
- To raise standards of learning in P.E. lessons by utilising more effective lesson planning, equipment, and differentiation.
- To continue to compete in inter and intra sports events.
- To continue to provide all pupils with opportunities to build their character, confidence and social skills.
- To continue to provide a variety of opportunities to all pupils so that they
 can fulfil sustained periods of physical activity in break times, P.E.
 lessons and extra-curricular clubs.
